LOCAL GROCERY PRICES IN THE WBOP June 2025

This infographic explores supermarket grocery prices in Tauranga and the Western Bay of Plenty. The grocery price data is derived from a mystery online shopper pricing a 68-item food and grocery basket at the same seven local supermarkets, on a monthly basis. The shopping list is calculated for a basic weekly shop for a family of four – two adults and two children.





This month saw our shopping basket at PAK'nSAVE (Cameron Rd) coming in **\$35 cheaper** than the most expensive shop (compared with \$40 cheaper Mar-25).

The cheapest basket in Te Puke in June was \$220.72 at New World, a 2.8% increase since March.

The basket cost in Katikati was \$228.26 in June, a 1.8% decline since March 2025



Shoppers in Te Puke and Katikati paid more for their weekly basket than in Tauranga.



There are a couple of stand out grocery items that have large percentage variations between the lowest and highest price during the June 2025 grocery shop.

Chicken Drumsticks usual selection wasn't available at Woolworths Cameron Road for the June 2025 grocery shop which forced the purchase of organic Chicken Drumsticks at a significantly higher price.

Vegetable Oil had a large percentage difference between the lowest and highest prices for the June 2025 grocery shop. The cheapest option was available across all 7 supermarkets.

A word from the Mystery Shopper

The price variations between supermarkets at different locations can be significant. It was noted during the April shop that Gala Apples were \$1.69 at Cameron Road PAK'nSAVE and \$4.99 at Papamoa PAK'nSAVE (195% difference).

We observed during this period (April - June 2025) a number of price increases from month to month for items that were marked as "Everyday Low". This label doesn't necessarily mean the prices remain constant!





Things we have noticed









- 1. Increasing grocery prices: Stats NZ has reported food prices nationally have risen at their fastest rate in 18 months (by 5% annually to the end of July 2025, and with meat, poultry and fish rising by 7.9%). Business commentators have speculated that prices are likely to remain high for the foreseeable future.
- 2. The escalating price of butter: There has been lots of commentary this quarter about the high price of butter with soaring global butter prices blamed. Nicola Willis the Finance Minister has said that the best response to high butter prices is working to increase competition in the supermarket sector.
- 3. Growing demand for community food support: There have been both local and national reports of increased demand for community food support (ie. food parcels and community meals). Tauranga Community Foodbank reported an 18% increase in people needing support in the first months of 2025 compared to the same period last year.
- 4. Government Response Directed by the Government, the Ministry of Business Innovation and Employment (MBIE) has called for feedback from investors and prospective international grocery market competitors on the barriers to entry, investing and growing competition in the market. Submissions closed in May. It is hoped this information can be used to inform next steps for improving competition in the grocery sector.
