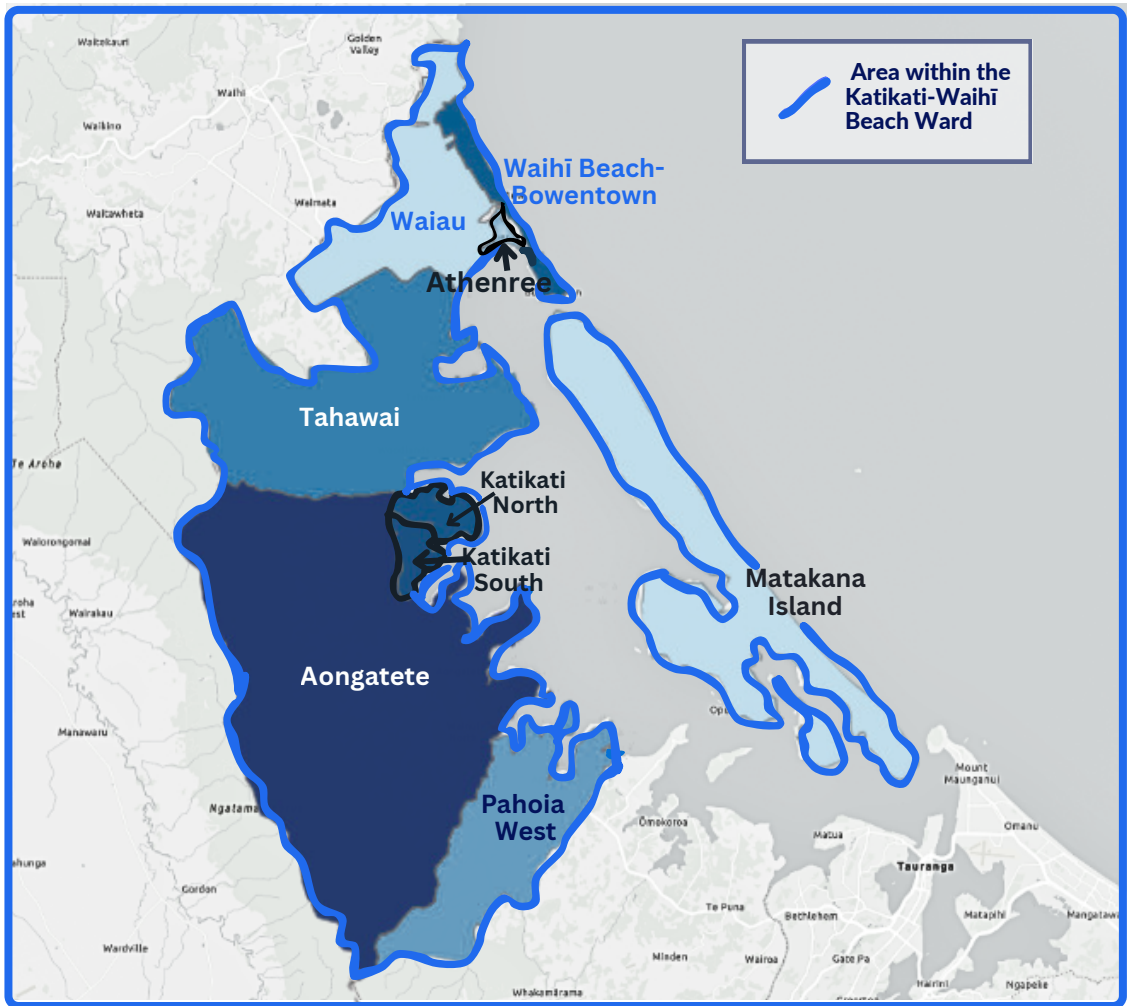

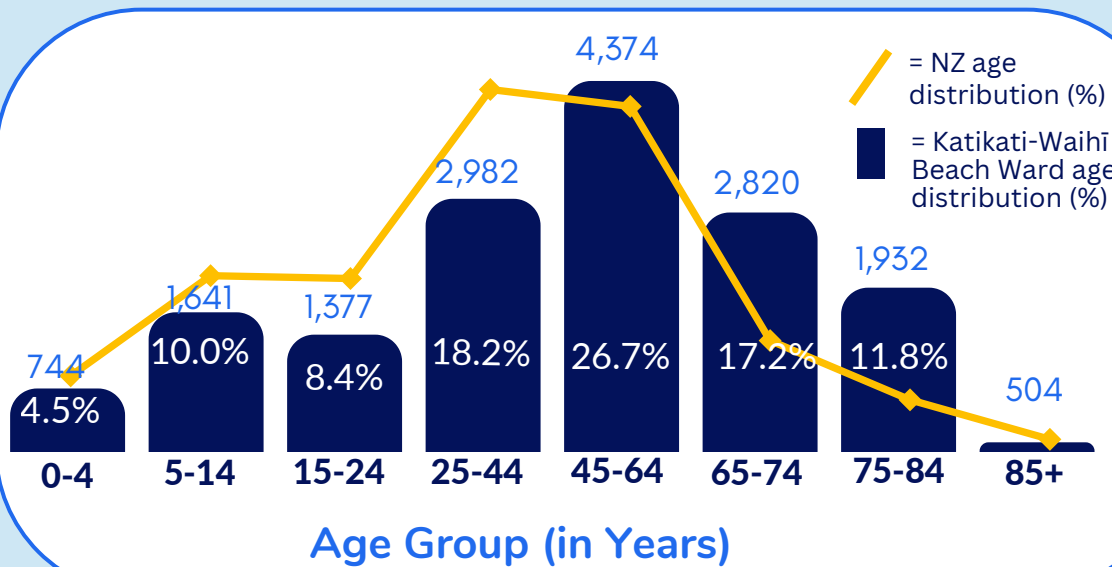

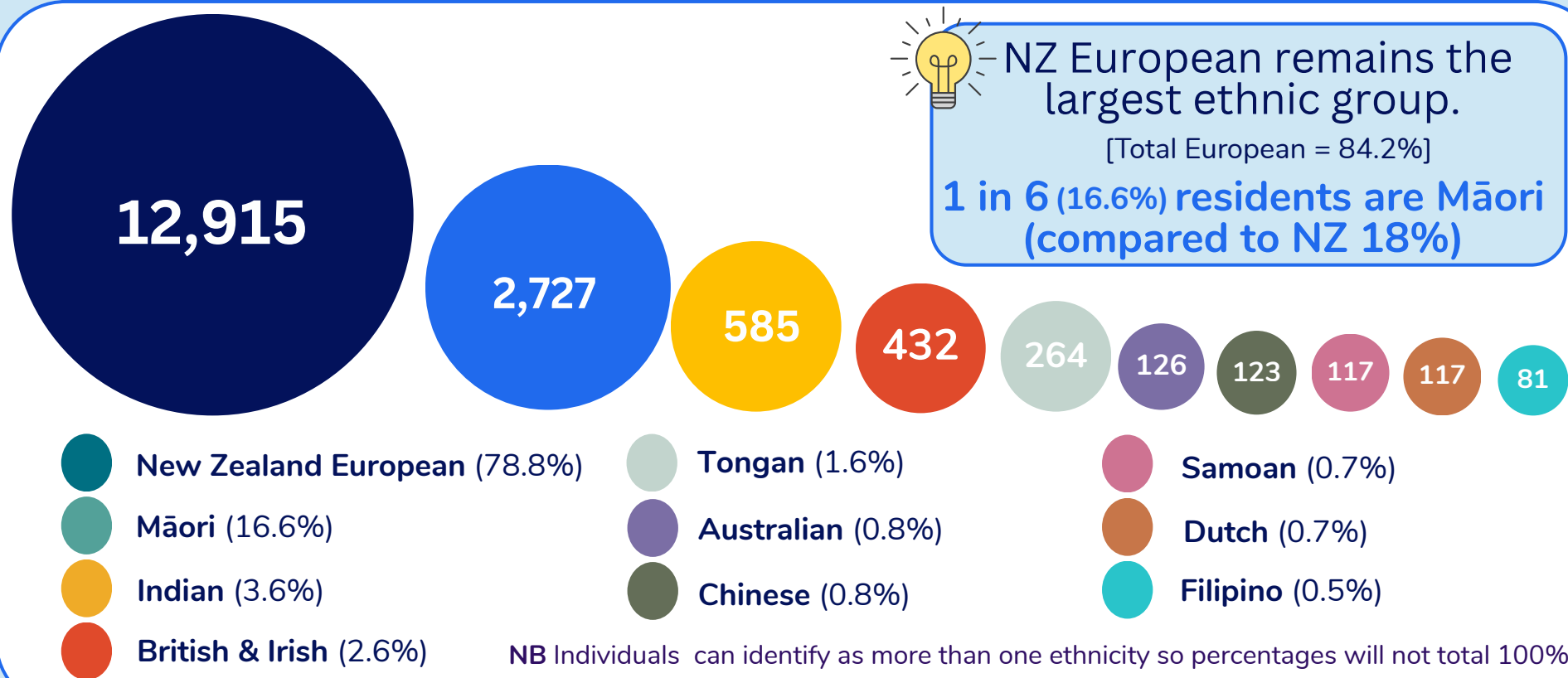

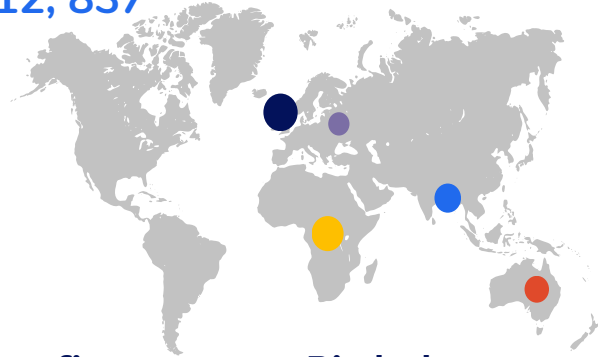

- The category "Other European" representing 1.8% of reported ethnicities (n = 288) is a grouping of multiple European ethnicities so hasn't been included in the ethnic group summary.
- This variable combines all Census activity limitation questions to identify whether individuals (aged 5 years and over) have difficulty performing any of six basic universal activities because of a health problem. The activity limitations included are: seeing and hearing (even if wearing glasses/using a hearing aid), walking or climbing steps, remembering or concentrating, washing all over or dressing, and communicating (using your usual language). Read more at Stats NZ. A more robust estimate of disability levels is available in the Household Disability Survey, but this is not available for small areas.

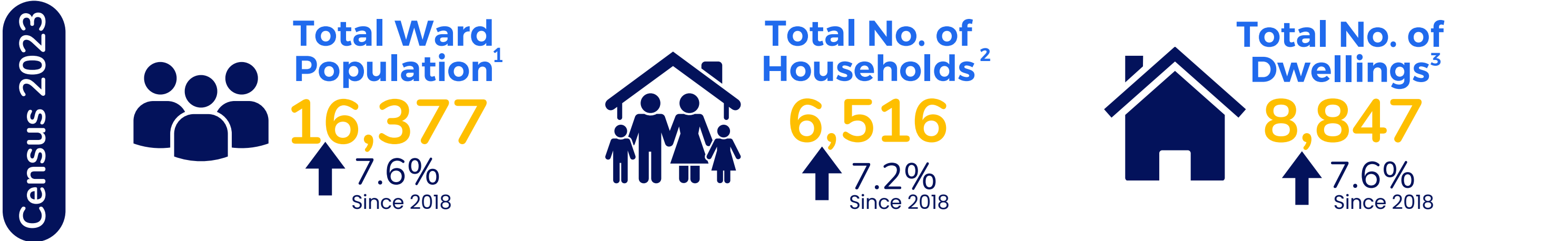

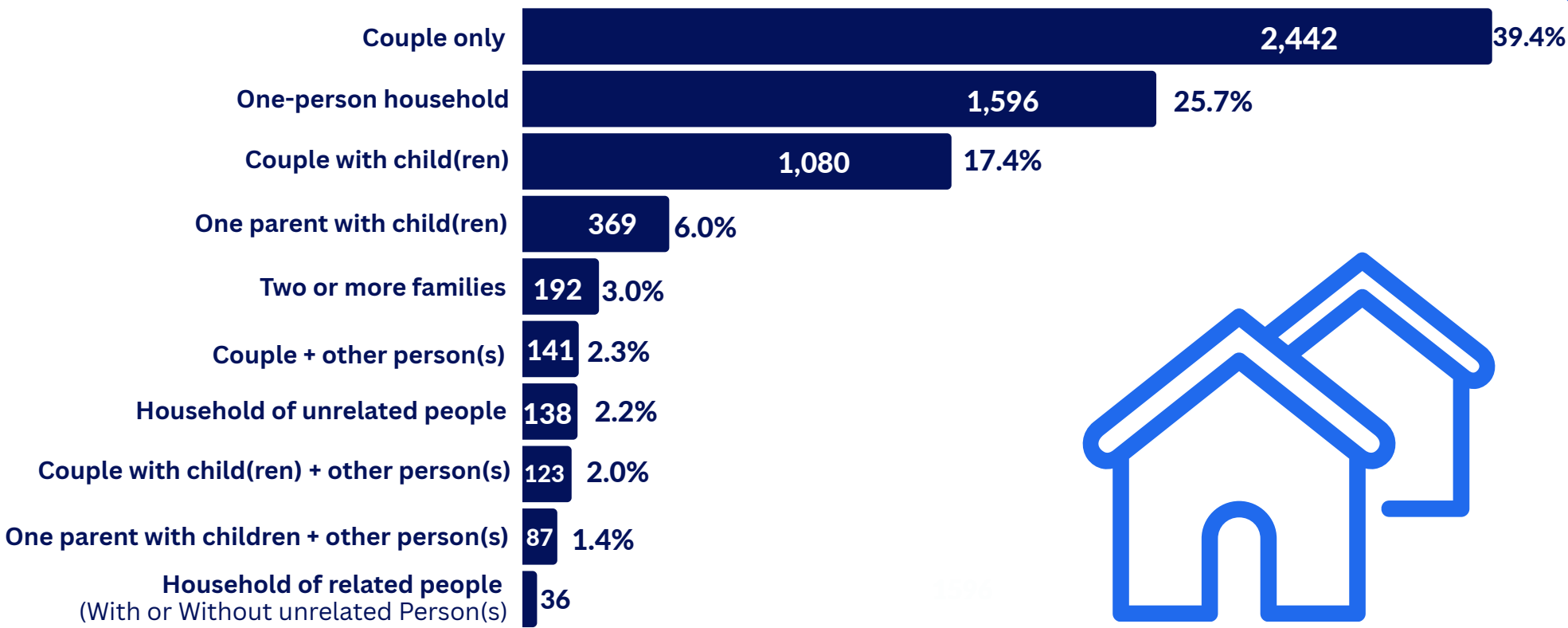

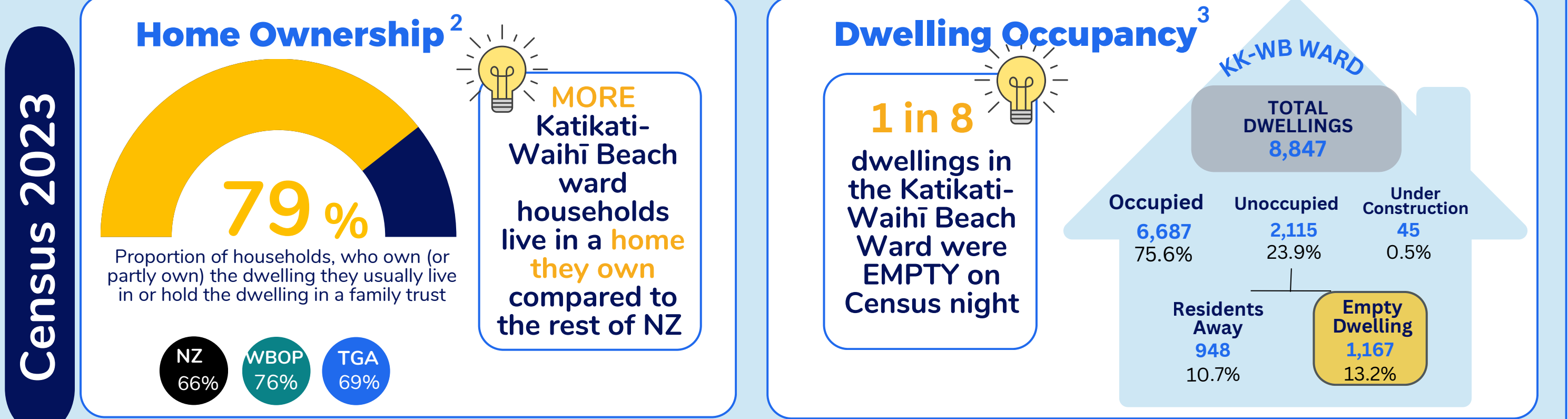

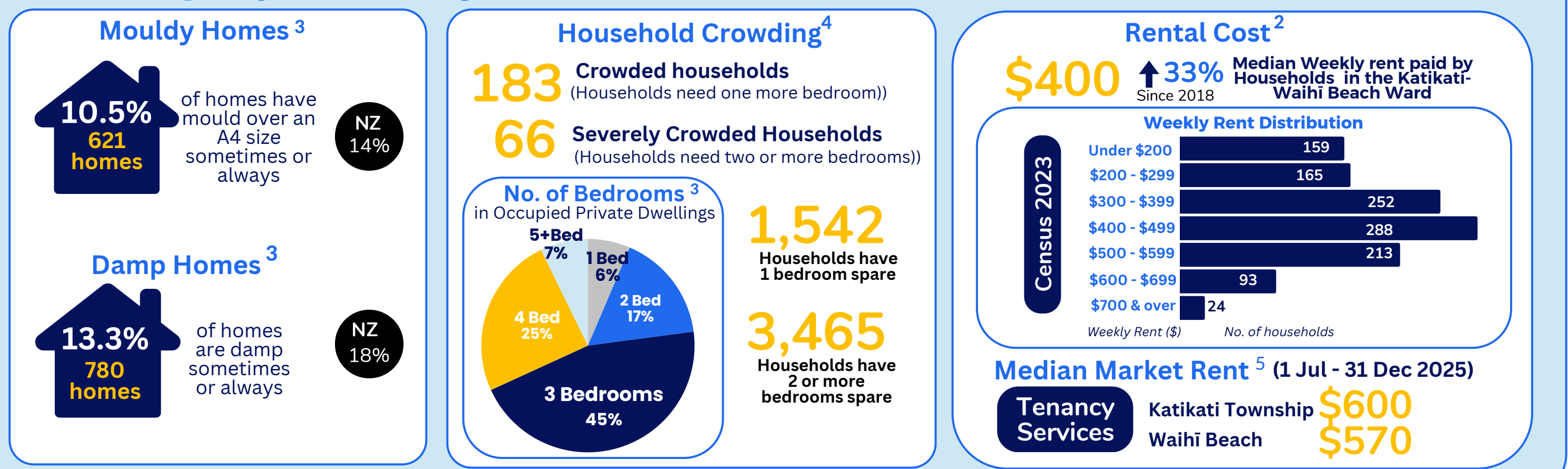

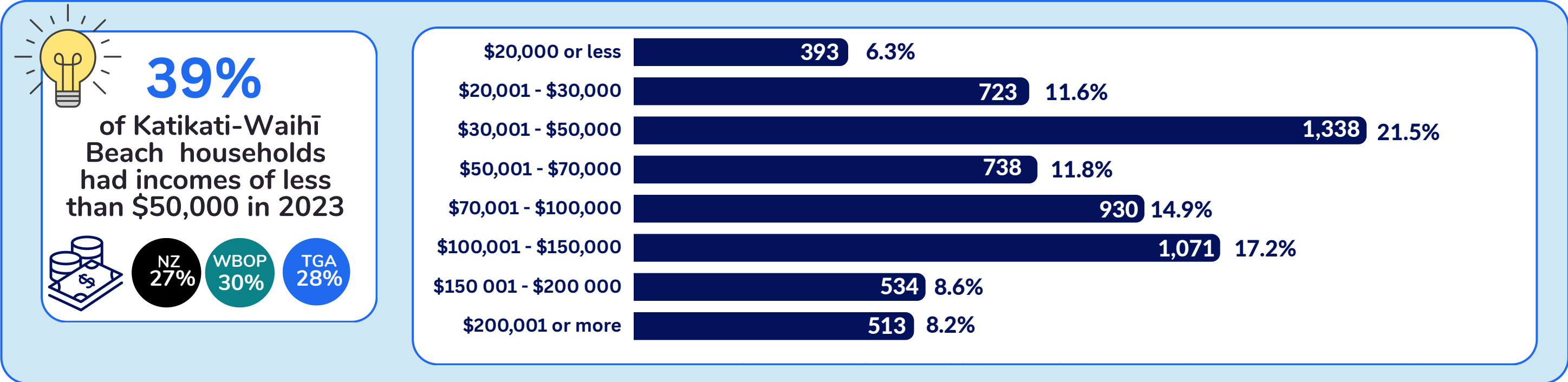
Median Household Income¹



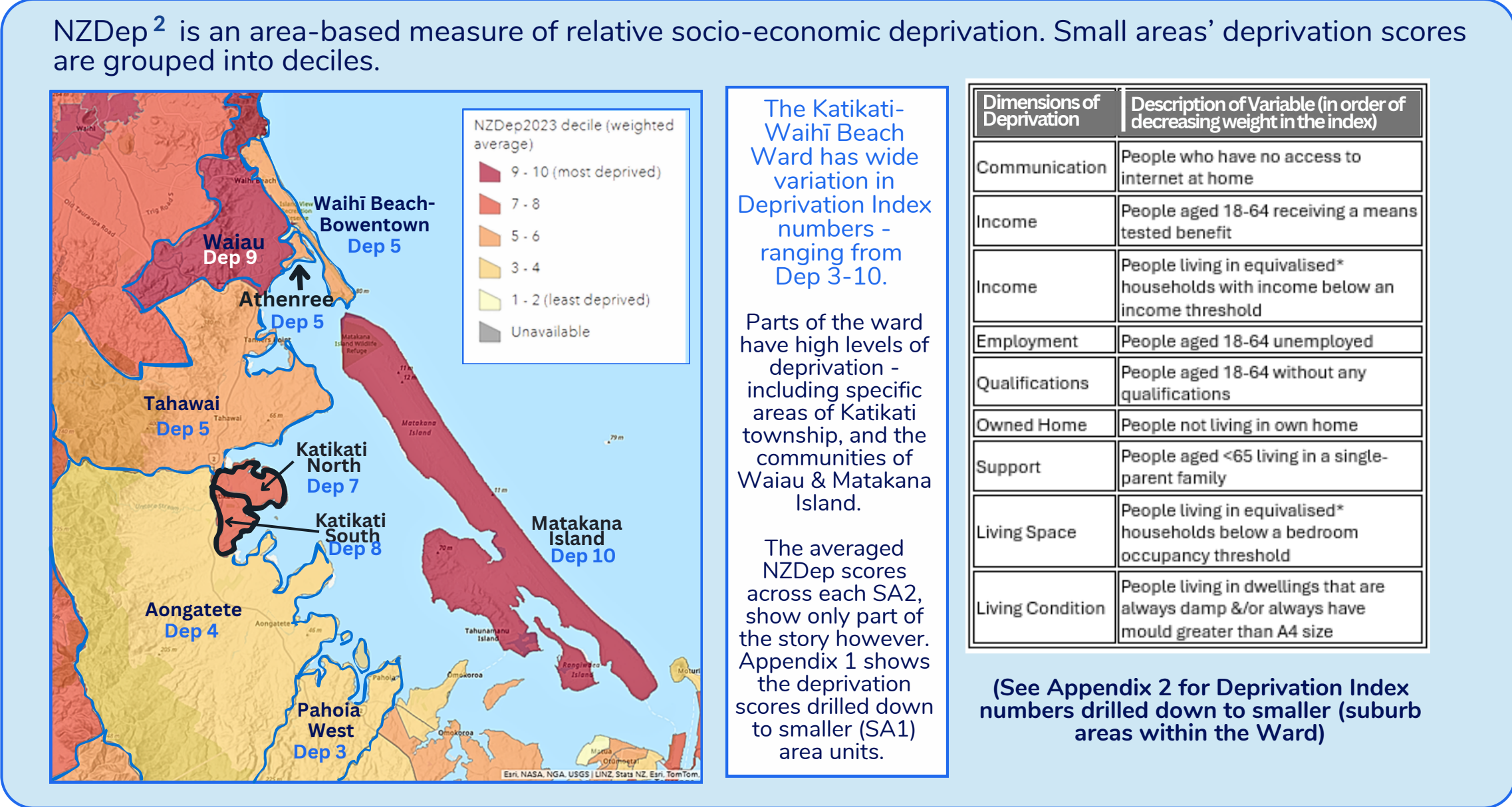

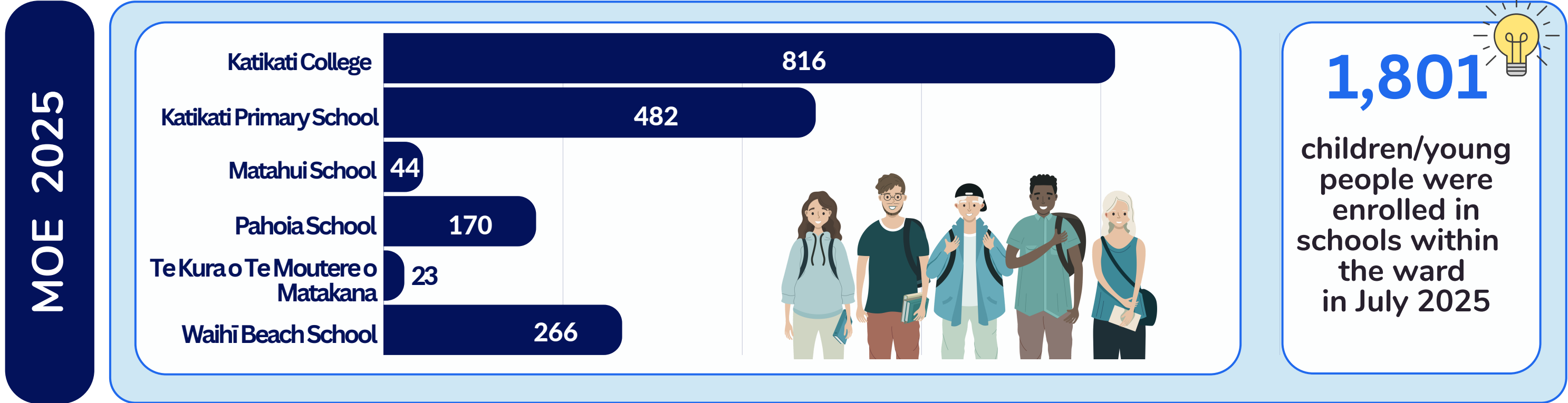

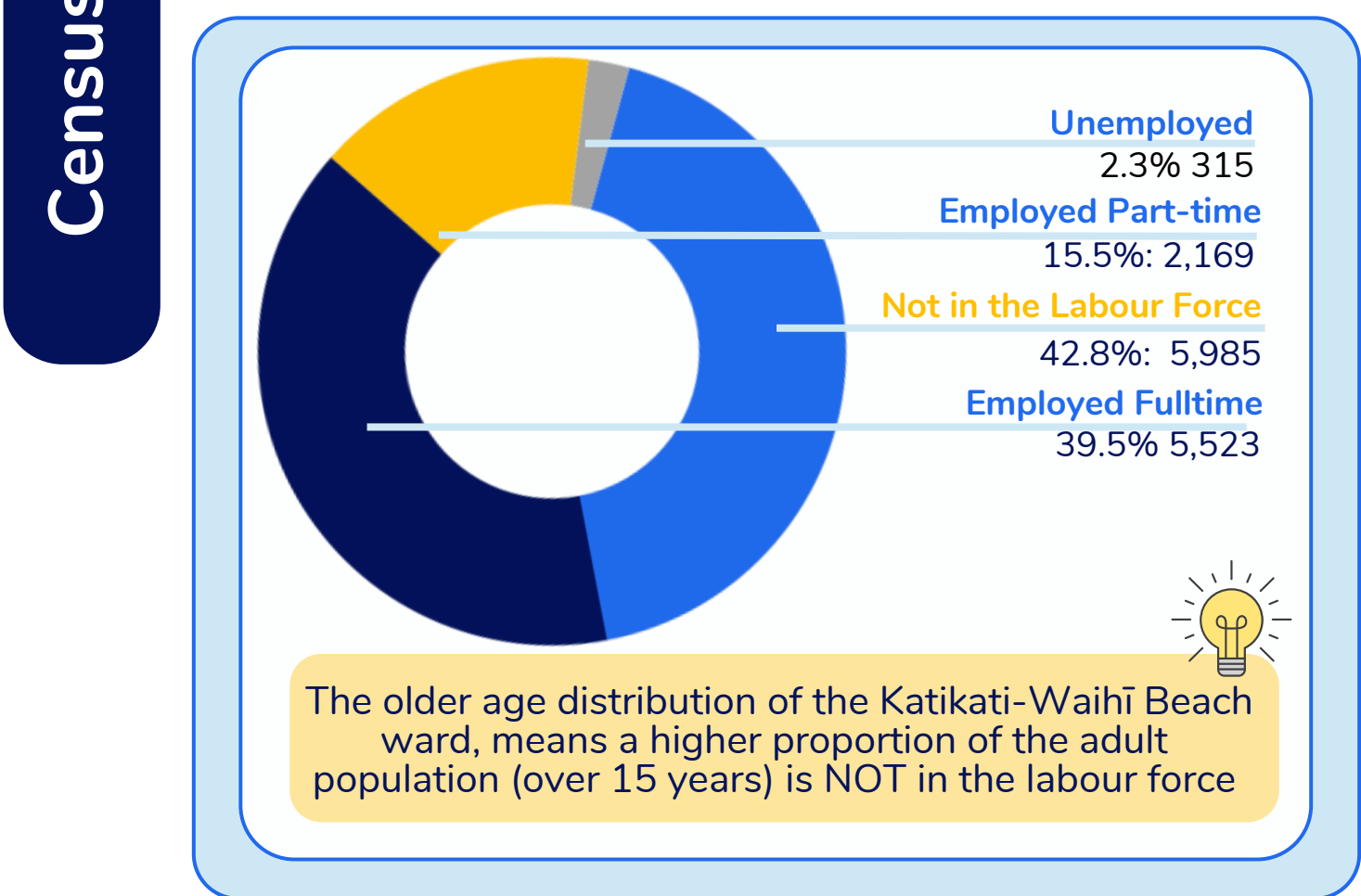
Katikati-Waihi Beach School Rolls¹



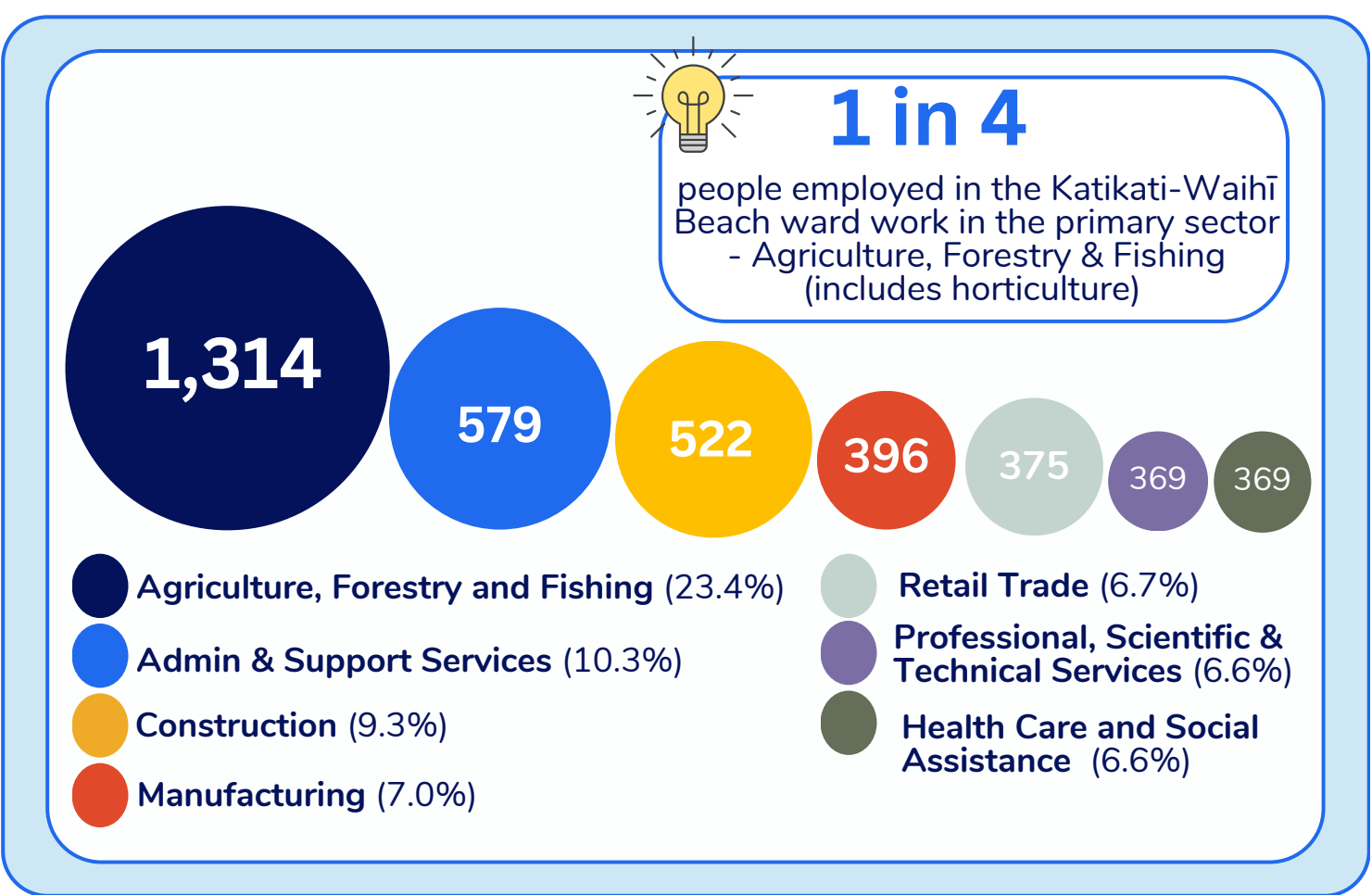

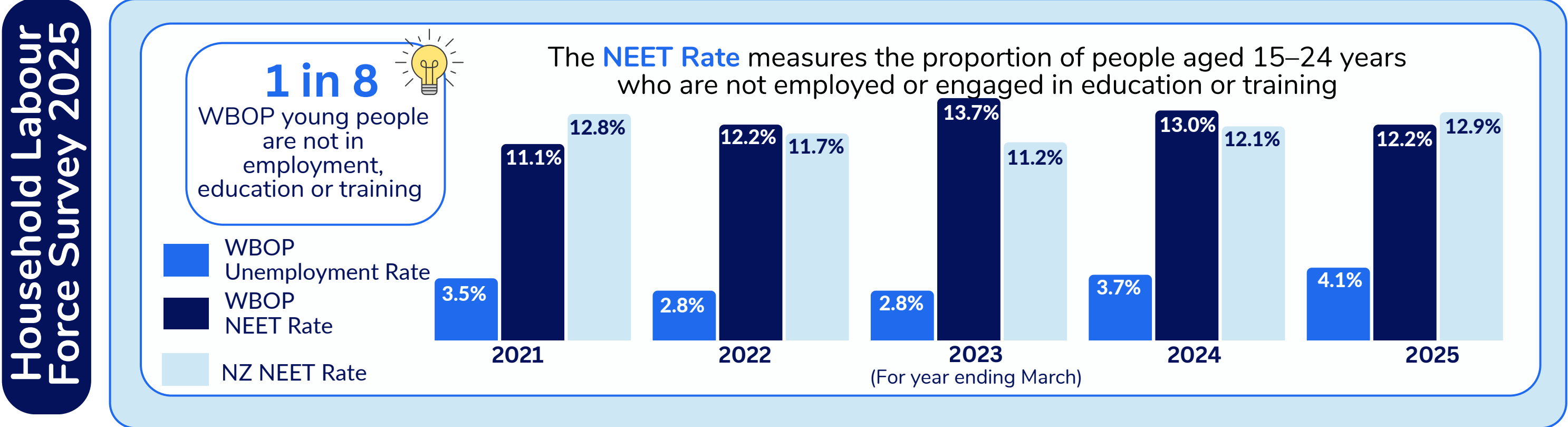

Marae/Hapū in the Katikati-Waihi Beach Ward ¹

Otawhiwhi Marae

Principal hapū is Te Whānau a Tauwhao of the Ngāi Te Rangi tribal collective. Mātaatua waka Wharenui = Tamaoho; Wharekai = Tauwhao

Tuapiro Marae

Principal hapū is Ngāti Te Wai of Ngati Ranginui (& Ngāi Te Rangi) Takitimu & Mātaatua waka Wharenui = Ngā Kuri a Whare; Wharekai = Muriwai

Te Rereatukahia Marae

Principal hapū is Ngāi Tamawhariua of Ngāi Te Rangi iwi. Mātaatua waka. Wharenui = Tamawhariua; Wharekai = Whakahinga

Oruarahi Marae (Te Rangihouhiri)

Principal hapū is Ngāi Tamawhariua of Ngāi Te Rangi iwi. Mātaatua waka Wharenui = Te Rangihouhiri;

Opureora Marae

Primary hapū for the marae are Ngāi Tuwhiwhia and Ngāti Tauaiti of Ngāi Te Rangi

Opounui (Rangiwaewa) Marae

Primary hapū is Te Ngare of Ngāi of Te Rangi. Mātaatua waka Wharenui = Rongomainohorangi

Kutaroa Marae

Primary hapū for the marae is Ngāti Tauaiti of Ngāi Te Rangi iwi. Wharenui = Tauaiti

Rangiwaewa Marae

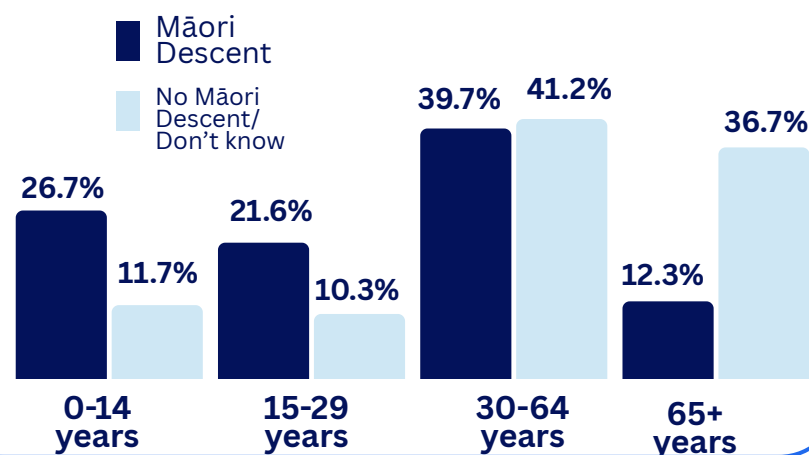
Primary hapū is Ngāi Tauwhao of Ngāi Te Rangi. Mātaatua waka Wharenui = Te Haka a Te Tupere

Iwi in the WBOP ²



Census data provides some insights into iwi affiliation of people across the WBOP district.

The two local iwi whose rohe (area in which they are mana whenua) is within the Katikati-Waihi beach area are Ngāi te Rangi & Ngāti Ranginui.

Along with Ngā Puhī (NZ's largest iwi), these are the three iwi to whom the most WBOP people were affiliated.

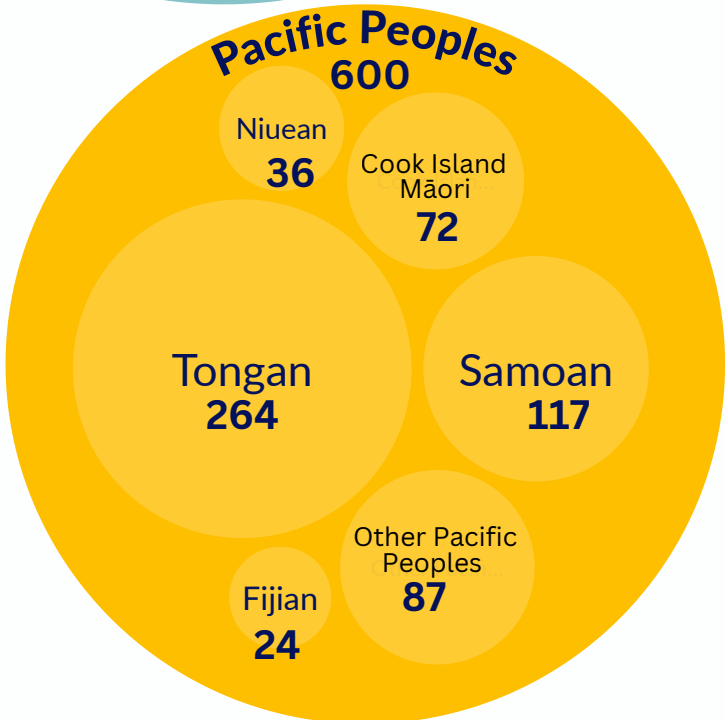
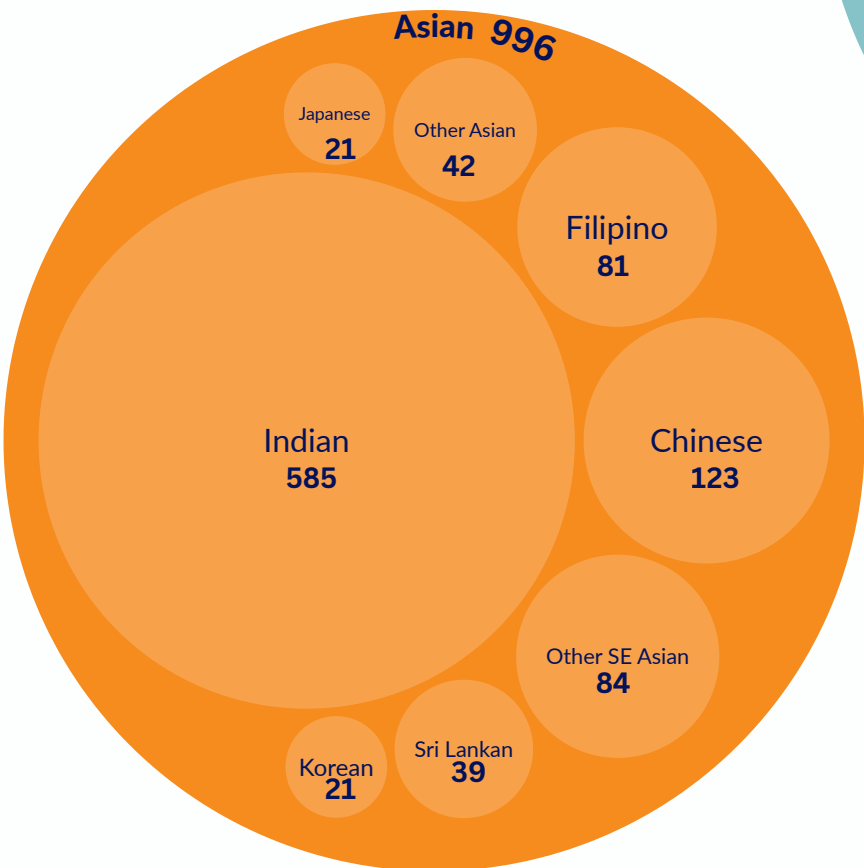


While the vast majority of Katikati -Waihī Beach ward residents identify their ethnicity as NZ European, a diverse array of additional ethnic groups are present within the population.

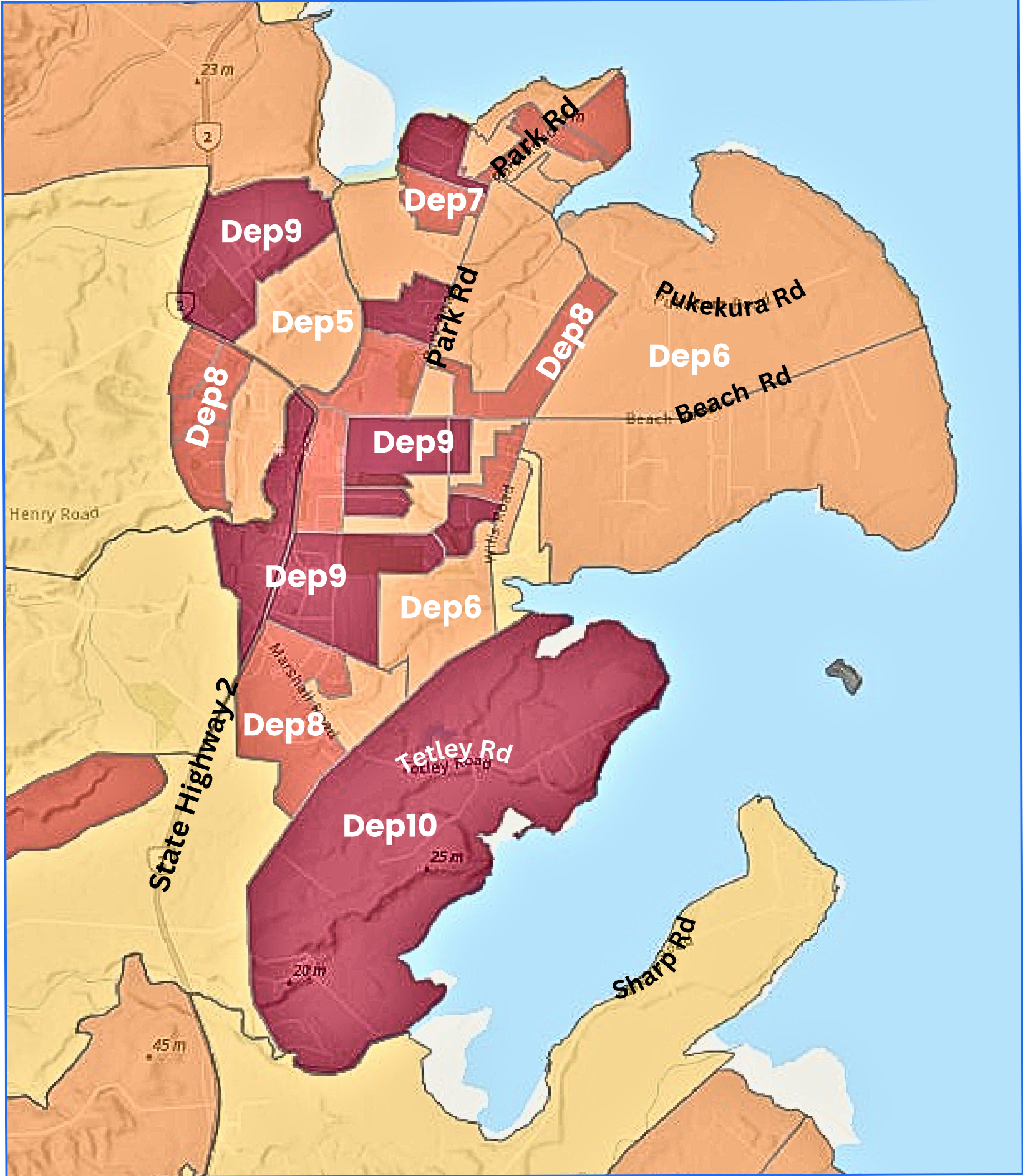


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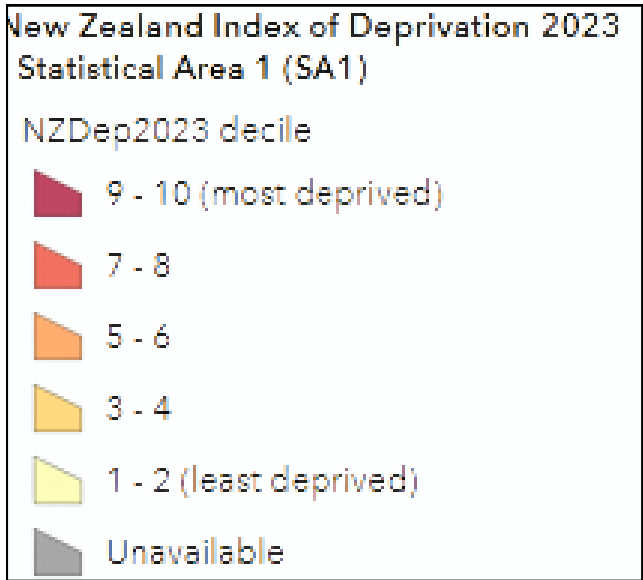

New Zealand Index of Deprivation, 2023 (NZDep2023)
This map provides information on socioeconomic deprivation, using the New Zealand Index of Deprivation 2023 (NZDep2023).

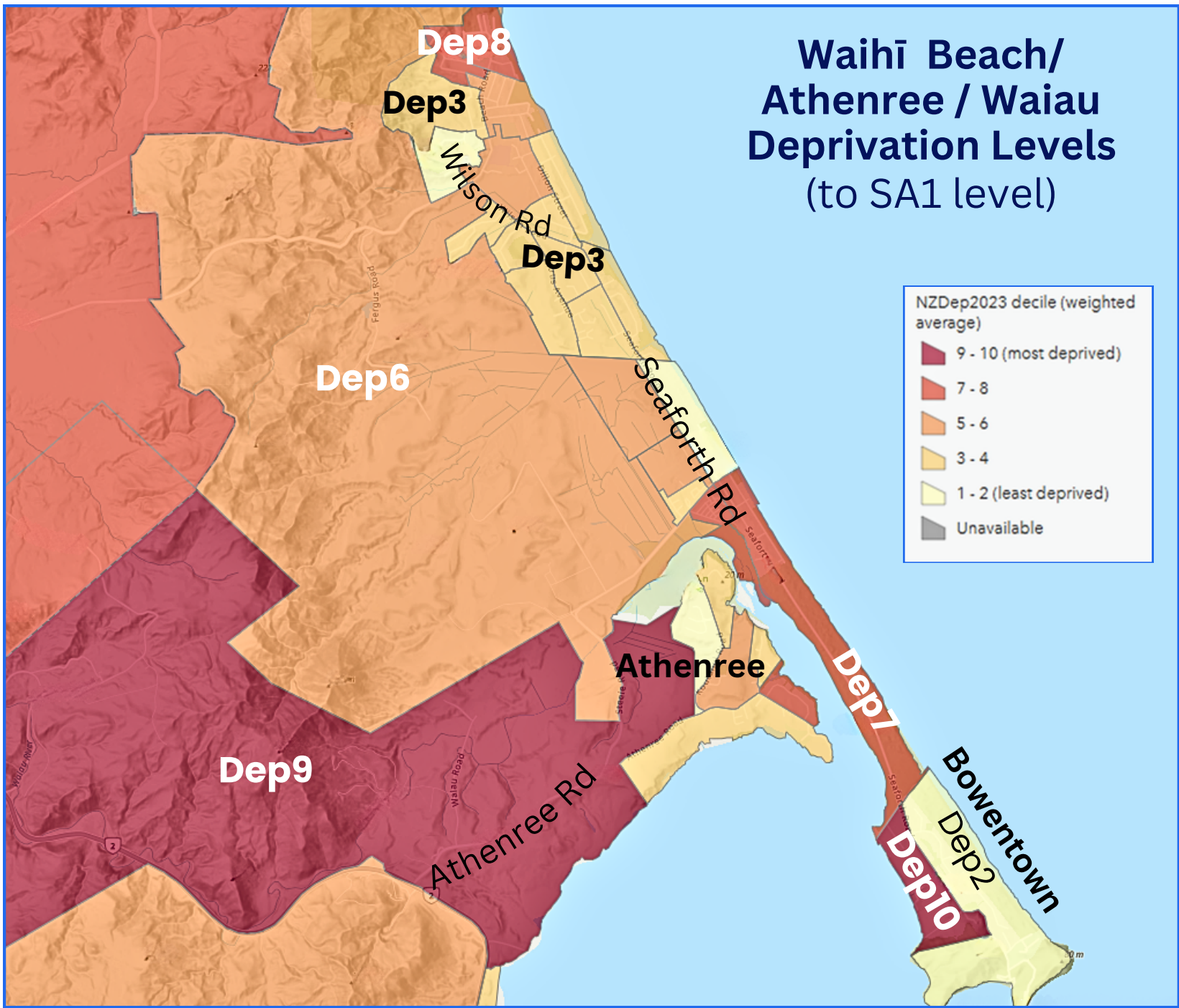
The NZDep is an area-based measure, which measures the level of deprivation for people in each small area and is based on nine Census 2023 variables.

NZDep2023 is displayed in 10 deciles:

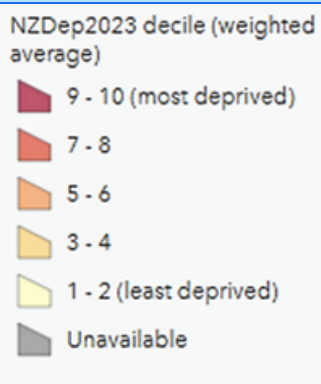
- Decile 1 represents areas with the least deprived NZDep2023 scores
- Decile 10 represents areas with the most deprived NZDep2023 scores

Waihi Beach/ Athenree / Waiau Deprivation Levels (to SA1 level)



The DepIndex provides estimates of averaged deprivation across areas. When viewed at lower level SA1 (urban block) geographies, specific areas with high levels of deprivation become more visible. In the visualisations on this page a number of smaller areas within Katikati township are seen to have deprivation levels of 9-10 (high deprivation).

While much of Waihi Beach and Bowentown has very low deprivation (1-2), there is still a pocket of high deprivation in Bowentown.
